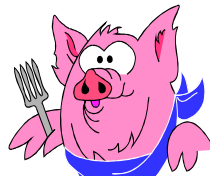

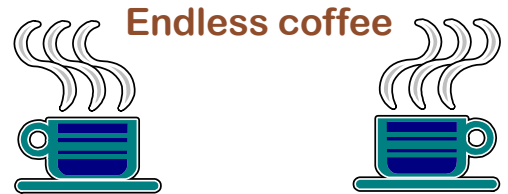

We will be going there Sunday the 16th and staying with my brother. He lives near the Johnstown expressway which takes you downtown ending at the convention center.

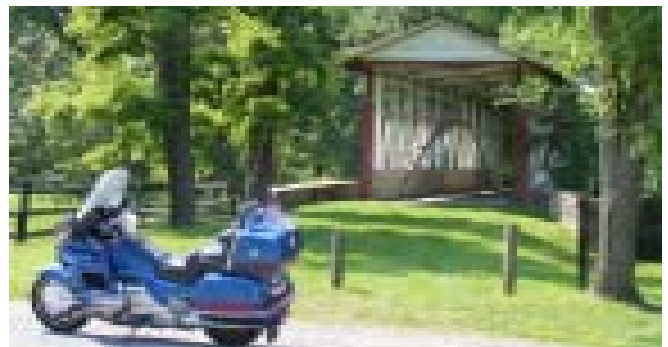

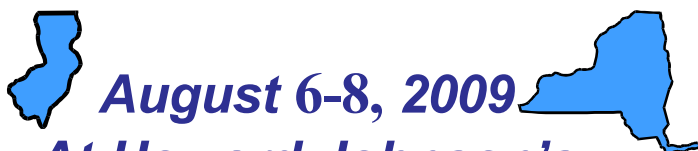

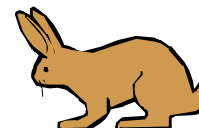
