The district meeting was held in January and there was a lot of good information put out. The biggest news, as far as I was concerned, is that the Dash for Cash point system was re-vamped and it is even easier to get points. First of all instead of only being able to get 1 point per chapter per year we can now get 1 for attending a meeting / gathering and 2 each for any 2 other events on their ride schedule for a total of 5 points!!! We can still get 2 points for any rally within our region and 1 point for rallies outside of our region. Attendance at our rally (NY/NJ) as well as Wing-Ding is now worth 3 points. The points for Ride for Kids has been changed. Now, not only is it worth a point to show up, but if GWRRA NY is in the top 5 for total donations every chapter in attendance will receive another point. But wait, there's more!! If GWRRA NY is top dog in donations, and we

darned well should be, we will each receive another point making a total of 3 points possible. Any chapter that hosts a district event (Ride-In, Ride-Out or a picnic or get-together approved by the district and open to all NY members) will receive 2 points for each event.

Now with all those points just waiting for us to go scoop them up it shouldn't be hard for us to get 10 points, right? Well that's what the officiating persons figured so they decided that we will need to accrue 20 points to get our chartering fees paid for the year. It still seems like it would be easy enough to do. All it involves is riding (we are riders, right?) and socializing (we're pretty good at that, too!) and a little planning. I am self-appointing myself to coordinate the effort again this year but I will ask you this. I would like to not have to come up with all the plans on places to go. I don't mind doing some but not all. If you see on the calendar that another chapter's event falls on a day that you and the friends that you usually ride with are planning on going for a ride, let me know and I will make the necessary contacts and set it up for you to visit them. You don't necessarily need to be there for the whole event, but long enough to get a picture of your group taken with the highest chapter officer present. Of course, again, you need at least 6 members. Send the picture and pertinent info to me and I will make sure we get credit for it.

There is an interactive calendar on the NY district website that, by the time riding season hits, will be full of all the chapter's scheduled events and anyone can check and see what's going on. If you have any questions call me.

Now for my first suggestion of how we can go on a nice ride and still get some points. Dee and I are starting to make our summer plans and we have decided to continue on after the Ride for Kids on the 18th of July and go up through Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia for a week stopping for the afternoon / evening on Friday the 23rd at the New England district rally and returning home on Sunday the 25th. We will be traveling only about 300 miles a day and with some exceptions traveling by state highways instead of interstates. This should leave plenty of time for sight-seeing and relaxing. Also we are planning to go whale-watching in the Atlantic Ocean from Nova Scotia. The more people we get to go, the more fun we can have. If you are interested let us know. We will probably be making reservations by mid April.

Of course the Ride for Kids and the district rally will be worth points on the Dash for Cash. Let me know if you're interested. Have a Happy Valentine's Day,

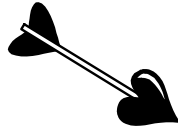

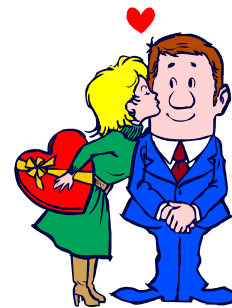

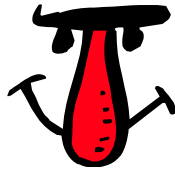

NY-W Rider Educator's Corner

As we enter the “second half” of the winter season, plans will be made for the ride schedule, and other events for the 2010 season.

It's not too early to begin evaluating our personal riding gear. Take time to look over the condition of each piece of equipment.

Helmet – check for nicks, cracks, neck strap and snaps, inside padding and fabric. Remember that if your helmet has been dropped, it's a good idea to replace it. A dropped helmet doesn't have the degree of protection at the point of impact that it should have. For those using face shields, look for cracks, heavy scratches, security of snaps, and anything that might impede your vision or field of view.

If you use safety glasses or goggles, do the same as evaluating a face shield. If your safety glasses are prescription, are they current for your eye exam and/or latest driver's license renewal.

From the District Educator Why Rider Education

This month, I've taken a very important excerpt from Mike Stiger's January newsletter for all educators. The following is extremely important for the continued success of our organization.

GWRRR favorable IRS Ruling

In 1983, GWRRR was awarded its 501(c)4 status based on the “Education Program” we provide our membership and public. Many members perceive social welfare to mean providing a social environment, when it really means it provides education. Based on this, we must stress the importance of education to maintain our 501(c)4 status.

Based on the GWRRR 501(c)4 ruling, subordinates:

- . Must operate primarily to further the common good and general welfare of the people of the community i.e. Rider Education (Community is both the

Gloves — are the palms flexible and allow for solid grip, or do they slip on the hand grips. Do gloves fit properly, or are they too loose/long in the fingers. Replace as necessary.

Footwear — Are shoes/boots over the ankle for support. Do soles provide the right amount of tread not only for riding comfort, but also prevent slippage on wet/oily road surfaces when feet are on the ground.

Jackets/Pants — Do jackets provide some reflective ability, or do you have a reflective or high visibility vest that can be worn over your jacket. Are riding pants/jeans comfortable enough to ride in, or have the holidays caused them to be too “snug”. When riding, are the pant legs long enough to come closer to the top of footwear. **Raingear** – Is your raingear in good condition. Are all zippers, arch straps, and shoulder straps functioning as designed and manufactured. Are there any tears or rips that indicate the jacket or pants no longer keep water out.

All the above are things that we have plenty of time to check over and replace where needed. Remember that we need to dress for the environment and for safety.

Membership and Public)

- . The organization cannot be operated primarily as “a social club for the benefit, pleasure, or recreation of its members.” Again, however, social functions for the benefit of members may be carried out if they are incidental to the organization's primary purposes.
- . At least 51% of activities focus on Rider Education.
- . When considering whether an activity is education” or “social”, it must stand the test “Did it benefit the Community (members and/or public) by presenting “Rider Education” related subject matter?” Remember, the “Burden of proof” rests with the Director of the Subordinate to demonstrate to the IRS that stated “educational” activities are valid, and that the level of “educational” activities are greater than the level of “social” activities.

Note: As referenced a GWRRR Subordinate includes all GWRRR Chapters, Districts, or Regions.
