### How to Hard Boil A Perfect Egg Every Time

At one of our recent dinners I had a discussion with a gentleman on why the green ring around the yellow of a hard boiled egg sometimes appears. I never get that ring when making hard boiled eggs, but am not sure why, so... I decided to ask Google. This is what I found...

The discoloration is due to the formation of ferrous sulfide where the yolk and white meet. It's formed when "iron from the yolk reacts with hydrogen sulfide from the white."

Discolored egg yolks are harmless, but if you want to keep your yolks a more appetizing yellow, the following guidelines are:

- Keep the eggs in a single layer in the pan.
- Cover the eggs with water, bring the water to a

Remember, this is the time of year when deer start thinking about love and they become much more active and travel over larger distances and more and more during the daytime. We need to be very observant during their mating season. As well, as the days become shorter and shorter, many smaller animals will become present during the evening riding hours.

Be especially careful when riding between open road and a stretch of road protected by trees. You can very easily ride from dry road onto extremely slippery road conditions. Also there is my personal pet peeve, people who mow their yards and discharge the clippings onto the road. Wet grass can create an extremely slippery road condition.

As we all know, we are out there to observe the fall foliage, but then again so are all of the other leaf peepers. Remember, their thoughts are focused on the foliage and not necessarily on proper driving skills. Be very observant as they can be distracted very easily by the foliage. They will not be looking at you.

boil over high heat, then turn off the flame.

- Let the eggs sit in the hot water for 15 minutes for large eggs (or 12 for medium, 18 for extralarge).
- Run cold water over the eggs after they're done so they don't overcook.

Here are the directions on how to boil the perfect egg.

1. Put eggs in pan of water so that water covers eggs by 1-2 inches and bring to a boil. Put eggs in single layer.
2. As soon as eggs boil, turn off flame, remove from heat, cover, and let sit for 10 minutes exactly.
3. Add plenty of cold water to pan to stop cooking.

At this point you can drain and peel them for eating or recipes or put them into the fridge for a later use.

His calm welcoming manor always made you feel comfortable when you talked with him.

Jim was born June 5, 1945 and retired as an Engineer from Xerox. Jim was a proud veteran serving in the US Army in Vietnam and performed duties as a helicopter door gunner until it was discovered that he also knew how to fix the radios in the helicopters. This earned him a safer post back on the flight line repairing the on-board electronics. After his hitch in the Army he went to work for Xerox and met Jim Pearson where they became life long friends and shared many adventures together.

Jim had a son and a daughter and accepted Kathy's son and daughter as his own too. He was the proud grandfather to seven grandkids. Besides his family, Jim loved the outdoors as he enjoyed being outside hunting, riding his motorcycle or fishing. He also enjoyed ice boating and hang gliding.

His first long distance motorcycle trip was a week long trip down the Blue Ridge Parkway, not on a Wing but a Yamaha 350. He must have enjoyed the trip because he moved up to an 1100 Gold Wing and then to the Jupiter Orange 1800 that many of us recognize him for. He joined GWRRA in 2004 and has been an active member since.

Kathy and Jim really enjoyed riding their Wing. They would often just hop on it and head out somewhere just the two of them and the open road. They both looked forward to their annual leaf peeping tour where they would go riding through the Adirondacks for the weekend enjoying the fall display of colors. They took many longer trips and toured the North East, the Carolinas and went as far West as Colorado and as far south as Florida.

I got to know him best when we met up in Knoxville

We began making general conversation but soon ended up trading treatment stories. Even though cancer treatments are not fun, we both enjoyed a few chuckles that cancer patients seems to understand. When it came time to move on to the next activity I think we both got up feeling a little better. I know he made me feel a lot better. I remember saying a prayer for him as the Pearsons and Jordons left for home. I looked forward to another opportunity to visit with my new friend. Unfortunately that day never happened.

During the receiving hours I was surprised to find out that Jim was an accomplished woodworker. They had several examples of his work on display and in pictures through out the room. I was especially impressed with a child size compound bow hand carved by Jim. Can you imagine the memories someone is going to have with that bow. Not only will it have the special meaning that Jim made it for them but chances are there were the hours the two of them spent together learning how to shoot it. Maybe the possibility of a hunt too.

Jim built more than just bows. The list continues on to gun stocks, furniture including two bedroom sets, kitchen cabinets on down to general carpentry with Kathy and Jim building his hunting cabin and up keep on his home. During a remodel he could often be seen teaching the building inspector better ways of solving the construction problems. I am not surprised. Jim had one of those analytical minds where he easily solved problems, especially when he need to build something the correct way.

Jim was committed to others as well. He took care of an elderly neighbor that lived next door to his parents. He kept an eye on her long after his parents were no longer around. His last visit was just weeks before he passed too. Jim was active with the Patriot Guard giving fellow veterans the proper respect they deserved. It was a stirring sight to see the Guard stand their vigil for their fellow member.

I was very impressed with what everyone had to say about him. He was loved, and every acquaintance was proud to have known him. Devoted to his family, cared about his neighbors and was a friend to everyone. Jim Jordan will be missed by all who have had the chance to meet him.
