
everal years ago just before I met my riding family here at Chapter W I had pulled a copy of the ride schedule off the bulletin board at a local



basic information is listed below. Any of you who shiver at the sound of "geek speak" can stop reading now.

For those who are interested in making the import yourself here is what you need to know:

First our calendar is available in the iCal format which is a standard format for sharing calendars electronically. The calendar is also available in XML and HTML but most devices won't use them.

Next the address of the calendar is <a href="https://www.google.com/calendar.google.com/public/basic.ics">https://www.google.com/calendar.google.com/public/basic.ics</a>. Note: all of the letters are lower case so 0 is a zero and not an uppercase 'o'. Make sure you are careful with the '1's and 'l' (lower case L). There are no uppercase 'i's. If you are reading an electronic version of this newsletter (PDF) just copy and past the link when needed.

Using this information you can then go to your calendar program and add it. When a change is made on the website calendar the changes will be reflected in your calendaring program. Depending the program you use, you can optionally turn the ride schedule on and off or have it show up in a different color. The options available will depend on the software you use.

If you have an iPhone, iPad or iPod Touch you just need to go to settings, scroll down to "Mail, Contacts, Calendars". On the next screen select "Add Account" followed by "Other" in the list of types. You then need to select the "Add Subscribed Calendar" in the Calendars section. Finally you are asked for the server and that is where you enter the long address above. If you did everything correctly it should verify and then after a few minutes you will see the ride calendar events added to your Calendar App.

Anyone using Outlook can open it and select Calendar along the left side. From the toolbar or right click on calendar select "Open Calendar" and then "From Internet". Enter the above address when asked and the ride schedule will then show up in your Outlook calendar. There are a lot of different versions of Outlook so hopefully these steps will work. If not, contact me and we will figure out what needs to be done.

If you have some other program that you use for your calendar let me know we can figure out the steps required to add the Ride Schedule to your electronic calendar. I will also try and add the steps onto our website so others may learn from it.

Now you don't have any excuse to not remember one of our rides. I hope to see you join us.



## Team Riding Refresher

With many of us heading to Wing Ding, the

upcoming Bi-State, and being in the middle of the summer ride schedule, I felt that it would benefit all of us to freshen up on our Team Riding knowledge and skills. The following is from the Team Riding seminar.

members of the team. Members of the team realize that their individual actions while riding have an effect on the other team members. Team members ride with awareness and focus.

#### Plan the Ride

♦ Always plan out the ride route ahead of time.

Consider checking the route either physically or by checking with travel planning services to make certain there are no construction obstacles. Just prior to the ride check the weather forecast.

- ♦ Make certain that the route isn't too aggressive (lots of corners) or too uncomfortable (mountain riding with few barriers) than what team members are comfortable with.
- ♦ Plan for breaks, fuel stops, food and rest. Not everyone can ride 150 miles nonstop.
- ♦ Plan for the worst-case mileage and the smallest bike in the team (s). Make certain that any medical needs, including food, are considered.
- ◆ Plan the speed of the team (s). Never assume that all team members are comfortable at the speed of the Lead. Some riders get very uncomfortable at highway speeds.

## Responsibilities –Lead, Drag and Team Members

via CB and hand signals.

- ♦ Lead is also known as the Ride Lead
- ♦ Lead should be experienced and responsible individuals that members have confidence in
- ◆ Lead needs to be able to make decisions quickly and safely
- ◆ Lead sets the tone for the ride by making certain that the ride gets started on time and is organized
- ♦ Lead sets the speed of the ride ensuring that the team members are riding at a comfortable pace
- ◆ Lead maintains the communication with Team members, the Drag and other Leads
- ♦ Leads will communicate any changes in riding speed

- ♦ Leads are responsible for making certain that the ride stops and food breaks are on time
- ♦ Leads listen to the needs of the team members as the ride is conducted.

#### **Drag**

- ◆ Drag is responsible for the general conduct of the ride by keeping the Lead and members informed.
- ◆ Drag is responsible for making certain that all team members are abiding by the ride rules
- ◆ Drag is the first to notice any riding action on the part of team members that is unusual
- ◆ Drag is responsible for securing lane positions on multi-lane roads or highways allowing the team to execute a safe lane change
- ◆ Drag is responsible to drop off and assist any team members that have a problem
- ◆ Drags keep the Lead informed of traffic conditions such as getting the team through a busy intersection or informing the Lead that the team has successfully passed a vehicle on a two-lane road.
- ◆ Drags can assist in controlling the pace of the ride by informing the Lead of any team member who is falling back.


Both the Lead and the Drag should have operating CB's to communicate.

- ◆ Team Members are the members riding behind the Lead and in front of the Drag. They are responsible for:
- ◆ Riding their "own" ride. Only the individual rider can determine certain actions
- and make decisions that affect their riding.
- ♦ Arriving prepared and ready to go
- ◆ Making certain they have the ride information and route planning
- ♦ Communicating any change in lane position within the formation (Note: some riders are very uncomfortable riding in the right track)
- ♦ Maintaining the correct, minimum spacing during the ride
- Following the direction of the Lead

- ♦ Adhering to the schedule at stops and food breaks
- ♦ Minimizing CB traffic allowing the Lead and Drag to communicate as necessary
- ♦ Communicating to the Lead any issues that arise including the need for an immediate break, trouble with a bike, changes in physical condition, etc.

#### **Ride Conduct**

- ◆ The ride begins from the time the Lead requests Team Members to mount up until the day is complete.
- ♦ Members within a team maintain a 2 second following distance to the bike immediately ahead and a 1 second separation to the bike staggered in the opposite track.
- ♦ Members within a team maintain their relative track position. Don't wander between tracks.
- ♦ À Lead should call for a single file formation prior to entering corners. This will allow team members to use the full width of the road and not be limited to the

- single track.
- ◆ Team members will point out any road condition that could affect following riders (road kill, pot holes, etc.)
- ♦ When entering traffic (from a parking lot, merging into flowing traffic, etc.), team members will enter the flow as the safe opportunity arises. Drags are not to block traffic for purposes of allowing the team to enter the flow.

## Lubricating Sticky Switches on Your Gold Wing

ave you ever noticed that after being caught in the rain and having to drive several hundred miles on the highway that road dirt and grime covers every piece of chrome and plastic on our wings?

The dirt and grime will even penetrate into every hidden corner of the bike. One of the places that we overlook when cleaning is our switches and controls until you find yourself driving down the highway with your flashers on because they are sticking!

This is a fairly common but simple problem to correct. Many of us have mentioned at one time or another experiencing this problem. Even if you haven't experienced this problem yet - it's only a matter of time. Performing this procedure as preventative maintenance is a good idea! Preventive maintenance early will prevent sticky switches later.

Both the GL1500 and the GL1800 suffer from this

problem. There are push-on/push-off buttons on the handlebars that control things like cruise control, hazard lights, and the audio mute and push button Audio and Hazard Switches. The shaft connecting the buttons to the actual switches are lubricated inside with a greaselike lubricant. This grease picks up dust and dirt over time until it is not lubricating anymore, and acts more as an adhesive than anything else. It doesn't prevent you from pressing the button to turn it on. Where the problem arises is when you try to push the button again to turn it off! The tiny spring inside the switch is not powerful enough to push the button back out against the now sticky, dirty lubricant, and the button stays pushed in. As a result, you find yourself riding around with cruise control on, hazard lights flashing, and no music. The solution is quick and simple.

You will want a quick-drying contact cleaner that does not leave residue behind. A cleaner like CRC Electronic Contact Cleaner or WD-40 Lubricant is a good choice. Insert the cleaner straw into the right side of the tuning switch on the left grip; push it in until you



feel the resistance of the mute switch mechanism, and spray. Give it a 1-2 second burst. If the switch is already stuck, start working it in and out until it pops free. Once it is free, give it another half-second spray, and then work the switch in and out 10-20 times until the switch no longer sticks. On the right grip, the hazard light switch or Turning switch(for new GL1800's) requires that the left grip switch module be taken apart. There are two screws on the bottom that must be removed. Once the screws are removed, the top half can be separated from the bottom half. You do not have to separate them completely - you just need access to the underside of the top half. Insert the straw, up and toward the mechanism of the hazard light switch. Lubricate it the same way as described for the Mute switch. Once it's working well, snap the halves back together and retighten the screws. The cruise control switch on the right handgrip also has two screws on the bottom that must first be removed. The cruise control switch mechanism is much more exposed and can be easily accessed and lubricated. Snap the halves back together and replace the screws.

It might not be a bad idea to put this item on your annual winter maintenance list. It only takes a few minutes to perform, and will prevent frustration down the road-literally - usually when you're miles from home!
